
Case 13. middle aged man with anemia, occult blood positive in stools, endoscopy shows distal gastric growth





Carcinoma stomach seen as circumferential wall thickening on CECT Metabolically active and no metastases on PET





## Ca Stomach

- Endoscopy for biopsy
- CECT with negative oral contrast, best for locally advanced cancers and metastatic work up
- EUS in early cancers to assess involvement of gastric wall in T2 / T3
- Focal polypoidal mass or circumferential focal / segmental thickening or linitis plastic
- MRI in select cases as problem solving tool
- Critical to identify peritoneal, hepatic, lymphmodal and other metastases as surgery is intended to cure early cancers
- Generally poor outcomes with higher stages
- NACT in locally advanced cancers
